Tom made a motion to adjourn, Jesse seconded, all in favor and the motion carried. The meeting ended at 20.33.



Board Meeting Minutes - Jan

The GARA board of directors held their monthly meeting on January 13, 2013, at Captain Bills. The members present were: Tom Bertolino, KB1P; David Macchiarolo, AJ4TF; Jesse Lindley, K4AX; Cameron Conover, AJ4TW; Fred Lomax, KV4PI; Todd Smith, AK4TS; Roy Smith, N4BYU; and Greg Spencer, KG4UQV. Chan White, KJ4ADX, was also in attendance

Tom opened the meeting at 19:10

Tom spoke about some members who said they will not be renewing for 2014 and the reasons given Tom went over the treasury report since Craig Bondy, N8STA, could not make it to the meeting.

Todd gave the financial report and stated that the board really needs to get more revenue coming in. The board discussed some ideas about fund raising.

David gave the engineering report stating that he is seeing some issues with the D-Star controller database. David has replaced a bad Ethernet board on the D-Star gateway. The VHF repeater is working fine.

Roy said The board needs to send a memorial contribution in the name of Peggy Mauldin, N4JBM, who became a silent key on January 11th 2014

Jesse said he would like to see GARA offer alternate ways of collecting dues such as a link on the web site.

Todd said that he has discussed adding a forum plug-in to the web site, and that the board needs to look at a different web host.

Tom said that he is working on a presentation for a local elementary school. Todd said that he has some items on order from the ARRL that would be good to use for the school presentation.

Todd also spoke about the club picnic and stated that he has narrowed the choices down to Bur Mill Park and Gibson Park. After some discussion Roy made a motion that the club have the picnic at Bur Mill Park. Roy did not get a second.

Jesse then made a motion to go to Gibson Park David seconded and Tom and Todd both abstained, the motion carried. The picnic will be on the afternoon of May 24th, 2014.







Engineering Update for December, 2013 AND January, 2014

DECEMBER ENGINEERING UPDATE

There has been lots of activity behind the scenes in the past month. Our primary issue has been the failure of two network interface cards (NIC) in the D-Star repeater, breaking the connection between the repeater and the Internet gateway.

Last month, I told you about the network problem somewhere in the 10.x.x.x local LAN. The local 10.x.x.x LAN is used to allow the repeater controller and the gateway to access the Internet through the router. The problem was traced to a right angle PCI adapter in the repeater controller that the NIC plugs into, and I said last month that if the problem recurs, we would consider switching the local LAN to a USB to Ethernet interface.

The problem reoccurred only a few days after I wrote last month's column, so I replaced the right-angle NIC with a USB to Ethernet adapter. The repeater controller is a Windows XP machine, and it recognized the device with a minimum of setup activity needed. The D-Star machine was back on the air.

Alas, my enthusiasm was to be short lived. About a week later, I received another report that the D-Star machine was not able to link to other machines over the internet. Some troubleshooting indicated that the likely culprit was a failure in the internal local network, the 172.16.x.x net, which is a point-to-point connection that connects the controller and the gateway directly. Since that net is served on the gateway computer by a NIC plugged into the same type of troublesome right-angle PCI adapter, I zeroed in on that being the likely culprit. The gateway computer is a separate computer running CentOS Linux, so I knew that plugging in a new network card, especially a USB-to-Ethernet adapter, might not be quite as easy as it was under Windows. As I expected, although the device was recognized as a USB device, the device driver in the Linux kernel was too old to recognize it as an Ethernet port. Luckily, Linux is designed to be flexible and easily modified, (if one knows what they are doing). Device drivers are called 'modules' and can be loaded and unloaded from a running system without (in most cases) shutting the system down or rebooting it. (try that with Windows!) Here's how I did it:


I purchased a second inexpensive USB to Ethernet 10/100 adapter, just like the first one. There are many brands out there, but a lot of them will use the ASIX chipset. In this case, the device was an IOCREST USB 2.0 Ethernet Adapter, which uses the ASIX AX88772B chipset. The Linux kernel has a kernel module for these devices built in, called 'asix' but depending on the age of the kernel, I knew that I might have to compile a newer version from source code.

It's easy to find out:

Plug the adapter into a USB port.

```
$ /sbin/lshusb
```

Bus 001 Device 002: ID 0b95:772b ASIX Electronics Corp. AX88772B
Look for the vendor/device ID (in this case 0b95:772b). Now check the kernel driver 'asix' to see if the USB device is listed as part of the kernel:

```
$ /sbin/modinfo asix
filename:      /lib/modules/2.6.18-308.20.1.el5/kernel/drivers/usb/net/

In the case of the existing Linux kernel, it was not listed, preventing the operating system from recognizing it as an Ethernet device, so I had to compile a new driver module.

To compile the kernel driver:

- I got the correct version off the CD that comes with the device, and copied it to the computer. Included with the source code, was a "makefile" which describes how the source is to be compiled and linked.

- Make the kernel module by running the 'make' command:

```
$ make
```

The kernel module object code "asix.ko" will be created. To install it, I had to be logged in as 'root'. I removed the old kernel module from the running kernel:

```
# modprobe -r asix
```

- and then installed the new module:

```
# make install
```

```
# modprobe asix
```

At this point, the adapter was recognized as an Ethernet port, and I was able to configure the port using the Network Configuration tool. Also note that I did ALL of this remotely, from home (although I needed to go back to the site to reconnect the ethernet cable to the new adapter).

The D-Star machine is back on the air. I still have an issue with disk space on the gateway database that I need to work on, but I'll write about that in a future column.

VHF REPEATER:

I have much to tell you about the VHF machine as well. In order to be a good steward of your money, the GARA board of directors is looking for ways to cut the expenses that the club has to pay every month. One of the largest expenses is the telecommunications bill, which covers both the internet (DSL) connection, and the telephone line at the repeater site. Of course the internet connection is used to provide external internet service to the D-Star repeater. The telephone line is used to provide the following services

on the VHF repeater:

* Autopatch capability to club members (for those who don't know what an autopatch is, it is the capability to make local telephone calls using your radio over the repeater. Of course, they won't be private calls, since everyone listening to the repeater will be able to hear BOTH sides of the conversation!)

* Telecommand capability to the VHF analog repeater in compliance with FCC Part 97.213 rules

* Dial out capability to the Amateur Radio Newsline phone bank to play the weekly ARNL report during the Sunday night News and Information Net

The GARA board has contacted the telecom carrier (AT&T) and determined that the club can save over \$500 per year by dropping the analog telephone service from the account, and just keep the internet service. We are looking at several options for maintaining services on the VHF repeater, but, unfortunately, not all of the options include the autopatch capability. For sure, autopatch usage is not what it once was... back in the day, before the proliferation of cell phones and widespread cell phone service, amateur radio repeater autopatch was used much more than it is today. I think I have heard someone use the W4GSO autopatch maybe 3 times in the last couple of years. However, you should know that we are considering options that would disable the autopatch capability from the VHF repeater. If you have opinions about this topic, or any other topics, please contact any of the GARA board members and express them, either positive or otherwise.

JANUARY ENGINEERING UPDATE

Although December was busy for the Engineering Committee, January has been relatively quiet. I hope everyone had a nice holiday season.

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

After repairing the Ethernet ports on the D-Star Gateway (see the December report), the gateway has been operating continuously since then. I still need to work on the database, but it is not preventing the gateway from operating.

VHF REPEATER:

As I wrote in the December report, in order to save money on the monthly telecommunications bill for the repeaters, the GARA board is considering options that might disable the autopatch capability from the VHF repeater. If you have opinions about this topic, or any other topics, please contact any of the GARA board members and express them, either positive or otherwise.
