### **Regular Meeting Minutes January 27, 2014**

Tom spoke about the omission of the engineering chairman position on the ballot in November which resulted in no one being elected to fill that position. ## **Board Meeting Minutes - February**

The GARA board of directors held their monthly meeting on February 10th, 2013 at Captain Bills. The members present were: Tom Bertolino, KB1P; Craig Bondy, N8STA; Todd Smith, AK4TS; Cameron Conover, AJ4TW; David Macchiarolo, AJ4TF; Roy Smith, N4BYU; Fred Lomax, KV4PI; Jesse Lindley, K4AX; and Greg Spencer, KG4UQV. Layman Idol, KK4LLY, was visiting at Tom's request.

Tom opened the meeting at 19:00.

Tom said that he asked some key non-board members to attend and Layman was the only who could attend. Tom had asked Layman to attend because he hosts the Technical Forum.

Cameron spoke about a GARA DX Challenge Contest idea that he had to help raise funds. The board discussed this idea, and The board will continue to explore ideas.

Greg gave a summery of the January board of directors meeting. Greg also stated that he had updated the GARA club page on the ARRL website.

Craig gave the treasury report and stated that the club now has 69 paid memberships with a total membership at 83 members.

Tom made a motion to give a courtesy membership to Brian Wilson, NX4U, who is The Feed Line editor and website manager, Cameron seconded and the motion carried.

Todd said the money coming in from dues will not be enough to sustain the cost of running the club and he recommended that the board look at increasing dues next year. The board discussed some ways of increasing revenue and lowering costs.

Todd said he is working on setting up a PayPal account for GARA. He also stated that he has reserved shelter number two at Gibson Park for the GARA picnic. Todd said that the park would be a great place to hold a foxhunt during the picnic.

Tom passed out an income vs. cost analysis for the last few years that he put together. The board discussed the dwindling resources and the need to lower cost and increase income. Tom said that he has converted some of the old financial files from paper to digital files.

David said that in the interest of time, he had nothing further to report than what he had emailed the board recently.

Roy said that he has heard several people who are not members using the repeaters and said if club members hear them, they should encourage them to join GARA. He also spoke about donating to Amateur Radio Newsline and then made a motion to send \$125. There was no second, and the motion failed. Todd made a motion that the board inquire what is appropriate, Tom seconded, and the motion carried.

Jesse spoke about starting a web forum for GARA members and suggested that the club look at making some things that GARA could sell to raise money.

David said that the N4G permit has been approved, and he has had equipment pledged.

Tom said that the board needs to proceed with setting up the VoIP, as soon as possible. He also said that he would like to see one of the members-at-large take on the position of assistant secretary in case there was ever a time when the secretary was unable to make it to a meeting.

Cameron and Fred both volunteered to be assistant secretaries. Also, Cameron will line up presentations for meetings. Roy made a motion to adjourn, Jesse seconded, and the motion carried.

### **Engineering Update for February, 2014**

#### **UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER**

The engineering committee has received some reports on the D-Star repeater that the receive sensitivity seems to be lower than normal, and the output power also seems lower than normal. Both



of these conditions appear to be intermittent. The recent extremely cold weather appears to have exacerbated the problem, but this is only a theory, and is not yet confirmed. There are several possible causes for these conditions, but a drop in sensitivity at the same time as a perceived drop in output power makes me suspect a problem in the duplexer/feedline/antenna chain. We plan to collect some RF test equipment and make a trip to the repeater with the test equipment when the weather warms up a little bit, to take some measurements and try to ascertain what is happening.

As I reported last month, I still need to work on the gateway database. Additionally, a recent update on the 'dplus' linking software (to revision "K") also needs to be loaded. 'dplus' is the gateway add-on software that is maintained by Robin Cutshaw (AA4RC) that allows us to link to other repeaters and reflectors. Neither of these pending updates is preventing the gateway from operating, however.

#### **VHF REPEATER:**

The VHF repeater is operating normally, and we have not received any reports of problems.

### **Contest Update/Changes from ARRL**

There have been some changes in the ARRL Contest Branch following the January 23rd resignation of Mike DeChristopher, N1TA, as ARRL Contest Manager. Former Contest Branch Manager, Sean Kutzko, KX9X, catches us up on the situation. "Since Mike's resignation, a team of ARRL staffers, including former Contest Managers Dan Henderson, N1ND and myself, have come together to address the needs of the Contest Branch until a replacement is found. Dave Patton, NN1N, is managing this team.

"Our efforts are directed as follows:

- 1) Eliminate the backlog of overdue awards certificates and plaques;
- 2) Keep normal day-to-day Contest Branch functions running on schedule;
- 3) Restore the "customer service" side of the Contest Branch to superior levels.

"With the help of several ARRL staffers in the Awards Branch, we have sent out over 5,000 awards certificates in the last two weeks, including the 2012 CW and Phone Sweepstakes, the 2012 September VHF Contest, the 2012 August UHF Contest, the 2013 RTTY Roundup. 1,100 certificates for the 2012 10 Meter Contest were just sent to the ARRL mail room and should go out by the middle of the week. In addition, plaques for the 2012 CW Sweepstakes and 2013 RTTY Roundup were shipped. 2012 Phone Sweepstakes plaques were ordered last week and will be shipped within three weeks. We will continue to aggressively work on the backlog of overdue awards and hope to be caught up soon.
