In order to help our community celebrate the 233rd anniversary of the American Revolution's Battle of Guilford Courthouse, and to further practice emergency communications skills for service to our community, GARA members set up and operated Special Event Station N4G ("for Nathanael Greene") at Guilford Courthouse National Military Park on March 15th and 16th 2014 to commemorate this event in American history. The special event was held during the annual re-enactment of the Battle.

Many GARA members participate each year in the N4G Special Event Station. It is a great opportunity to promote Greensboro and make contacts around the country and around the world.

Our setup consisted of a dedicated 20m station with a 20m dipole, a multiband HF station with an

GARA Meeting Minutes


Regular Meeting Minutes February 22, 2014

80m Windom dipole antenna, and 2m / 440 station with D-Star capability. We also had a guest QRP station for most of the day on Saturday when John, W4DX, set up his Elecraft KX3 and made several CW and phone contacts with K2CPR.

We operated the station continuously from 0900 local time Saturday through 1100 local time Sunday. We elected to end the event a few hours early due to approaching rain, and we were able to get everything torn down and cleaned up before the cold rain started.



Weather and band conditions on Saturday, however, were very good. We made a total of 407 QSOs, broken down as follows: 20 meters: 217; 80/40/17/15/12/10/6 meters: 139; 2m / 70 cm: 51

Engineering Update for March, 2014

I hope everyone has returned to normal from what will probably be remembered as the "Ice Storm of 2014." We lost power Friday morning March 7th, and it stayed off until early Sunday morning March 9th. Although there were many trees down in the area, including both of my neighbors, we were fortunate that at station AJ4TF, we suffered no permanent damage.

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

As I reported last month, the engineering committee has received some reports on the D-Star repeater that the receive sensitivity seems to be lower than normal, and the output power also seems lower than normal. Both of these conditions appear to be intermittent. Weekend weather just hasn't been real good for the past few weeks, but as soon as we are done with the N4G special event station next weekend, we can get back to making some measurements.

A recent update on the 'dplus' linking software (to revision "K") has been loaded to the gateway. 'dplus' is the gateway add-on software that is maintained by Robin Cutshaw (AA4RC) that allows us to link to other repeaters and reflectors. The software was fixed to correct a bug that caused a problem when there are more than

50,000 entries in the registration database that gets propagated to every gateway.

VHF REPEATER

From time to time, we have received reports of interference being heard on the input of the VHF repeater, and have heard it myself. Those of you who have been around for a while know that this happens periodically, and we have never been able to track down the exact source, although a few years ago we were able to locate a possible source inside or near a church that is near the repeater site. Back in September we scanned the area again. Using a tape-measure 2 meter yagi, and my IC-92 HT (set to 144.55, repeater input frequency, and AM mode), we swept the area to see if there was any interference that was audible from several directions, and there did appear to be a peak coming from the shelter that houses the Verizon cellular equipment. Whether this is getting into the repeater input is not known, but after we take the spectrum analyzer to the site we can make a more thorough sweep.

During the ice storm, I monitored the VHF repeater frequently. On one occasion (Saturday afternoon March 8th) I heard some interference on the VHF repeater input, but it was "regular" and had a pattern to it.. not just random noise. So, something is going on that we need to look at. As I said, this occurs periodically but it is like chasing a ghost since it is intermittent. I only hope that when we are actually there with the test equipment that it will be evident.

NEW EQUIPMENT

As we reported at the last club meeting, the analog phone service at the repeater site has been replaced with a Basic Talk VOIP service coming over our internet. This seems to be working fine, and will save us hundreds of dollars per year on our telecommunications costs.

Leonard Wilson McGarity Jr. ("Link"), WV41

Leonard Wilson McGarity Jr. ("Link"), 58, of Wellington, FL was killed unexpectedly on February 17, 2014. Link was born on October 14, 1955 in Pittsburg, PA, the son of the late Leonard Wilson and Beatrice Henderson McGarity. Link attended Grimsley High School in Greensboro, graduating in 1973. He attended college at North Carolina State University, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Applied Mathematics in 1977. He was a member of Sigma Chi fraternity. He entered the US Marine Corps in 1978 and was honorably discharged in 1984, having earned the rank of Captain in 1983. He attended the US Navy Flight School in Pensacola, graduating in 1980. He was ship board landing qualified, helicopter air to air refueling qualified, was an instructor pilot, and a flight schedule officer. He was a pilot for the 1st squadron of new 3 engine helicopters in the USMC and was qualified on five different aircraft. Link was a pilot in the NC National Guard from 1987 to 1991, deploying to Ft. Hood, TX in 1991 in support of Operation Desert Storm. He was promoted to Captain and made company commander in 1989. He was also qualified in various single and multi engine aircraft and was a night freight pilot. In 1996, he entered the U.S. Army Reserve. Link was hired by American Airlines in 1989. Captain McGarity enjoyed a 25 year career with American Airlines flying routes both domestically as well as to the Caribbean, Europe, and Central and South America on the Boeing 727, 757, 767, 777, and 737 aircraft. Link enjoyed many hobbies. He was an Extra Class Amateur Radio operator (ham radio) with morse code proficiency. He also enjoyed riding motorcycles and flying airplanes. He attended EAA AirVenture in Oshkosh, WI every year with his two beloved daughters and friends. He will be greatly missed by his family and friends. He is survived by his two daughters Heather and Holly of Wellington, FL and his son Thomas of Greensboro. He was preceded in death by his parents and his brother Alex. The family is requesting that donations be made to the Marine Corps Scholarship Fund in Link's name.

A graveside service for Charles Edward Hux, 91, formerly of Greensboro, NC will be held at 11 a.m. Monday, March 3, 2014 at Salisbury National Cemetery.
