Depending on the ISS work schedule, you may be able to make a 2 meter contact with the station. The ISS down link frequency is 145.800. The uplink frequency is 144.490. Their call sign is NA1SS. Some hams had contacts using just the downlink frequency.



I believe astronaut Col Catherine Coleman KZ5ZTH is the ham aboard the ISS. Contact depends on her work schedule, and If she has free time.

GARA President, Donna Ferguson, KD4WIK, called the meeting to order at 7:15pm.


First, there were reports from the board members.

Engineering Update for March, 2012

March was a quiet month for the Engineering Committee, however April was a little bit less quiet.

On Monday evening, April 2nd, the W4GSO repeater site experience an extended power failure. Unfortunately, the backup generator failed to start, and both the VHF and UHF repeaters failed when the backup uninterruptible power supplies (UPSs) that support them ran down. Other equipment at the site, including the site owner's equipment, along with the tower beacons, also failed. I am not sure when the power came back on, as I was out of town that day, but by all accounts, it was off for at least 6 hours. Once utility power was restored, the VHF repeater recovered and came back on the air without any apparent ill effects. The UHF D-Star machine came back up, but the internet gateway did not come back to life. Some additional troubleshooting on the gateway machine resulted in two problems: a misconfiguration of the router (most likely caused by the power interruption) and a corrupted configuration file on the gateway server. Once these problems were corrected the gateway was restarted and is now working.

The faulty generator, which is not GARA equipment, but property of the site owner, has been serviced and is alleged to be back in full operation.

On Saturday April 14th, Arch, KT4AT, and myself, visited the site to make backups of the D-Star computer and the internet gateway server, and to make some performance measurements on the VHF radios. The primary VHF radio still has excellent sensitivity of around -133 dBm at the receiver input. The output power is about 75 watts, and the antenna and feedline are reading a VSWR of around 1.1:1. The backup VHF radio has slightly less sensitivity, but still excellent.

Upcoming projects:

- 1) The UPS battery on the VHF machine is close to 2 years old, and should be replaced. At the same time, I'll replace some of power supply wiring on the repeater controller and weather radio, which is a little bit on the sketchy side. This will probably require that the repeater controller be reprogrammed if the power is completely disconnected from the UPS for an extended time, but while we were there, we tested the reprogramming software that we have, and it seems to work.
- 2) The D-STAR repeater has some so-called "execution scripts" that have been installed on the internet gateway. These scripts are pre-packaged programs that can be executed by a user over the air to perform various functions. I'll report on the details after we test the functions out a little bit more. One of the functions looks at the most recently busy D-STAR reflector, and links the repeater to it, no matter where it is in the world. This might be interesting to try, and see what kind of DX we can pick up!
- 3) I had mentioned in a past article that the VHF repeater controller, although it works well, is an obsolete model that can't be purchased now. If it fails, the repeater would likely be off the air for a while until a new one could be procured and proved in. I am still looking at possible replacement controllers, and I will report on this in a few months.

Order of the Long Leaf Pine

The following was printed in the Greensboro News-Record on Wednesday, April 18, 2012



Charles Weldon Fields Sr., 98, of Greensboro has been awarded North Carolina's Order of the Long Leaf Pine by order of Gov. Bev Perdue. He was involved in the formation of the Tar Heel Emergency Net, a daily over-the-air radio exercise which has operated continuously for 65 years on more than 23,000 occasions. The Tar Heel Emergency Net provides emergency communications for the citizens and agencies of North Carolina when usual means of communication are unavailable. Fields, known on the radio as "Weldon," was first licensed in 1930 and is still actively operating his radios under his call sign of W4AJT. In May 2010, Weldon led a two-hour hurricane exercise drill in conjunction with N.C. Emergency Management. He holds an appointment as an Official Emergency Station with the American Radio Relay League, the national association for Amateur Radio. The presentation was made April 7 at the Raleigh Amateur Radio Society's "RARSFest" annual gathering of ham operators from North Carolina and beyond. Created in 1965, the Order of the Long Leaf Pine is the second highest honor that North Carolina's governor can bestow on a Tar Heel state resident. The award is presented to North Carolinians who have made extraordinary contributions of dedicated service to their state.
