June is Field Day month. This year's field day is being held on June 28-29. It starts at 2:00 pm on Saturday and ends at 2:00 pm on Sunday. GARA, in conjugation with ARES, is holding this year's field day at Tannenbaum Park, Greensboro (the same place as last year's field day and where N4G special event was held). The field day site will be operating two HF stations and a Get On The AIR (GOTA) HF station. The GOTA station may be operated by any person licensed since the previous year's Field Day, regardless of license class. It may also be operated by a generally inactive licensee. Nonlicensed persons may participate under the direct supervision of an appropriate control operator. This is an excellent chance for hams: to operate on bands they are not authorized by their license class; or hams who have not been on the HF bands in while to get back on the air.

Everyone is invited to visit or help operate. If you cannot

make to this location, you can find other field day sites by going to ARRL's field day locator. The link to the field day locator is http://www.arrl.org/field-day-locator. If you cannot make it to the ARES/GARA's field day location, you may want to make a HF contact with them from your home station. The call sign they will be using is NA4GC.

Engineering Update for May & June, 2014

UPDATE FOR MAY

We were just shoveling snow a few weeks ago, weren't we? Now the A/C is running, and we're getting ready for Field Day. How the time flies when we're having fun!

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

Last month I gave an extended report on the power amplifier of the D-Star repeater. As of this writing, we are still operating on the borrowed amplifier, and it is still working well. I'll let you know when I get the original amp back and get it installed.

CORRECTION: Last month, in the article regarding the D-Star power amp, I reported that the power amp needed 2 watts to drive it. Sorry, I had a decimal place missing in my notes: it only requires 250 mW. Thanks to Arch, KT4AT, for pointing this out.

On the gateway computer, I reported to you some months ago that there was a problem with the gateway database that was causing it to grow larger, in fact it had grown so large that it was using almost 3 times the normal disk space. I finally worked up enough courage to run a script that came from the US Trust Server Team that basically erases and reloads the "external" part of the database: the part that gets updated every 15 minutes and shows at which repeater every D-Star user is located. The script did not affect the local users registered on W4GSO. After it ran, the disk space usage went back to normal (around 6 GB total) and it has remained there since I ran it. This script is normally used for gateways that have been off the air for a while, and cleans out old data entries. In our case, it fixed a corruption in the database that the system was working around, but by working around, it was causing the database to grow by creating copies of files. It has been running now for more than a month since I did this, and the disk usage has remained steady.

VHF REPEATER:

From time to time, we have received reports of interference being heard on the input of the VHF repeater, and have heard it myself. Those of you who have been around for a while know that this happens periodically, and we have never been able to track down the exact source. A couple of weeks ago, while hearing it, several of

us clearly heard audio of a station coming in. This points to likely interference from a repeater that is on the same frequency pairs as ours. There are a few that are suspect: K4USC in Union, SC is the most likely culprit, mainly since we have heard them clearly before. There is also W4LBT down in Lumberton, K2IMO in Elm City, and K4OBX out on the Outer Banks that are on the same frequencies as our repeaters. We'll keep listening out for it.

UPDATE FOR JUNE

I hope everyone is (getting ready / enjoying the memories, depending on when you are reading this) for/of Field Day. This year, as usual, I will be operating from the W4UA station (High Point Amateur Radio Club) as one of three operating positions, using my Elecraft K2, and LDG Z11-ProII tuner, along with a 130

ft doublet wire antenna. Our other stations include a 20 m 3 element beam, and a 40 m dipole. I'll primarily be on 80 m (when it's good) and on 15 m and above. I have been experimenting with a very inexpensive (< \$8) digital voice recorder module, and how to rig it up to use as a voice keyer (so I won't have to say "CQ Field Day" 10,000 times!) Look for an article on this soon.

If you can't make it to the Guilford ARES Field Day station this year, you can always come by W4UA and watch what a smaller club does for Field Day! We will be at 3139 Dillon Road (corner of Dillon and Sherrill Ave) in southeast High Point, just off Kivett Drive.

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

As of this writing (June 9th), we are still operating on the borrowed power amplifier, and it is still working well. I'll let you know when I get the original amp back



and get it installed. The Engineering Committee will be scheduling a work day in the near future to do some backups on the D-Star machine and other preventive maintenance on both repeaters.

VHF REPEATER:

From time to time, we have received reports of interference being heard on the input of the VHF repeater, and have heard it myself. Those of you who have been around for a while know that this happens periodically, and we have never been able to track down the exact source. Last night (June 8th), during the technical forum, I was listening



to KA4JRL who was operating from Lexington, NC (which is on the fringes of the coverage anyway). His signal had significant interference on it, but then suddenly cleared up for a few seconds, and then the interference returned. He reported hearing some type of "digital" interference at his location also. So, the detective work continues... We'll keep listening out for it.

NEW PROBLEM REPORTING SYSTEM:

The club has been working on an on-line problem reporting system that will be available to members to submit reports of repeater operation. http://w4gso.org/repeater_form.html

Amateur Radio "Dry Spell" Aboard ISS Ends - The ARRL Letter, May 29, 2014

Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) school contacts and any incidental, casual operation from the station have been on hold because no licensed crew members have been aboard the ISS since May 12. That situation ended this week, when Flight Engineer Alexander Gerst, KF5ONO, of the European Space Agency, Flight Engineer Reid Wiseman of NASA, and Soyuz Commander Max Suraev arrived at the ISS after a May 28 launch from the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan. Russia has threatened to exclude US astronauts from Soyuz flights because of US sanctions in the wake of Russia's annexation of Crimea. Scheduled ARISS contacts are expected to resume in July. Wiseman, Suraev, and Gerst will remain aboard the station until mid-November. -- NASA

③ Left-click and hold on the email, and drag it from the Promotions tab over to the Primary tab

④ Release the mouse and the email will drop into the Primary tab

⑤ Gmail will display a yellow box asking if you want to make this change permanent. Click YES to ensure that all messages from GARA appear in the Primary tab going forward.
