The Greensboro Amateur Radio Association (GARA) will be holding its Annual Open House on Saturday,

October 11, 2014 at the Hinshaw United Methodist Church, 4501 High Point Road, Greensboro. The Open House starts with Amateur Radio license testing at 9 AM with exhibits opening at 10 AM and closing at 4 PM. Admission to the exhibits is free.

The purpose of the Open House is to acquaint people with amateur radio by providing information on; how to obtain an amateur radio license, demonstrating on-air capabilities with modern radio technology, and how amateur radio assists government agencies in emergencies.

Some of the exhibits are; Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES), radio operations with 5 watts or lower (QRP operations), worldwide operations with a hand held radio (D-Star operations), and Digital operations (PSK 31).

New Amateur Radio Vanity Call Sign Fee

The FCC has adjusted very slightly downward - to \$21.40 - its proposed Amateur Service vanity call sign regulatory fee for Fiscal Year 2014. In a June Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM), the Commission said it was planning to hike the current \$16.10 vanity fee to \$21.60 for the 10-year license term. The FCC released a Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (R&O) in the proceeding on August 29, in which it recalculated the fee to \$21.40 for the 10-year license term. The \$5.30 increase still represents the largest vanity fee hike in many years.

The new \$21.40 fee does not go into effect until 30 days after the R&O is published in The Federal Register.

In the R&O, the FCC said it considered eliminating the regulatory fee for Amateur Radio vanity call sign applications but decided not to do so "at this time," because it lacks "adequate support to determine whether the cost of recovery and burden on small entities outweighs the collected revenue; or whether eliminating the fee would adversely affect the licensing process." The Commission said it would reevaluate this issue in the future to determine if it should eliminate other fee categories.

The FCC's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau sets the vanity call sign regulatory fee using projections of new applications and renewals, taking into consideration existing Commission licensee databases, such as the Universal Licensing System (ULS) database.

The FCC reported there were 11,500 "payment units" in FY 2014. The Commission said the vanity program generated an estimated \$230,230 in FY 2013 revenue, and it estimated that it would collect nearly \$246,100 in FY 2014.

The vanity call sign regulatory fee is payable when applying for a new vanity call sign or when renewing a vanity call sign, although some older vanity call signs are not subject to the regulatory fee.

In September, there were two(2) who passed their test(s), and earned either their Technician, General or Extra class license.



Engineering Update for September, 2014

Wow, it's hard to believe 2014 is almost 3/4 over!

I still have not done much this summer in the way of amateur radio, but I have been reading a lot about inexpensive (<\$30) GPS receivers that can be used as frequency references. These modules were designed for radio-controlled quadcopter drones, so they are relatively small. Just search the interweb for "Ublox NEO-7M Module". Just a few years ago, a high precision frequency standard costs tens of thousands of dollars, and required a rack mounted chassis. Look how far we have come!

Continuing on the 'look how far we have come' thread, you can now buy a 0 to 70 MHz direct digital synthesizer module that can output a sine or square wave signal for less than \$25. Combine that with an inexpensive mixer, and one of those RTL-2832 USB receiver dongles, you have an HF-to-UHF capable receiver, spectrum analyzer, etc. Lots of good winter project ideas, right?

I recently went to the shack of W4AJT, Weldon, to help him diagnose a problem he was having with his 1 kW linear amplifier (a Drake L4B). He was only getting about half the expected power out of it, and the plate voltage meter on the amplifier was reading low. He was concerned that something happened to the high voltage plate power supply. Using a 1000:1 high voltage divider probe,

we were quickly able to determine that the high voltage power supply was actually working, and that there is something else wrong with the amplifier... the metering circuit is not working

correctly, and the tubes are only putting out about half-power. It might be time for a new set of 3-500 tubes, so if anyone has some laying around that you might want to give to a good cause, I am sure that Weldon would appreciate it.

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

We are still operating on the borrowed power amplifier, and it is still working well. I'll let you know when I get the original amp back and get it installed.

Soon, I plan to do some testing on the D-Star receiver. I have assembled a cadre of fixed attenuators, they total up to 100 dB. I plan to use the IC-92 D-Star HT set on its lowest power setting (100mW = 20 dBM) connected to the attenuator string, through the HT antenna, to generate a very low level signal into the repeater's antenna system, while monitoring it at the site. By monitoring what the repeater's receiver is seeing, and alternately turning the RX preamp on and off, I will hopefully be able to determine if the preamp and the receiver are working as expected. I'll report when I am able to accomplish this.

Back in May, I told you about the gateway computer's database which was growing larger every month, and how I reset the database by running a script that came from the US Trust Server Team that basically erases and reloads the "external" part of the database: the part that gets updated every 15 minutes and shows at which repeater every D-Star user is located. I have been watching the disk space usage since then, and it has remained stable, and is no longer growing like it was.

VHF REPEATER

Although I don't listen to it during the whole day, my impression is that the interference on the VHF repeater has diminished. If someone has a different view, we would appreciate specifics (where were you, time of day, your operating conditions, etc.)

The club has an on-line problem reporting system that is available to members to submit reports of repeater operation or any other concerns. You can find this on the club web site.
