Cameron Conover, AJ4TW, is planning an outstanding family event. GARA will be operating as Class 3A battery powered club entry with a Get On The Air (GOTA) station. This means there will be 4 HF stations; one station dedicated to CW, one to digital, one to voice and one station that allow new hams, inactive hams and people without a license to operate. There will also be a 2 meter and a DStar station available to operate.

For those not familiar with the ARRL rules for a GOTA HF station, the station may be operated by any person licensed since the previous year's Field Day, regardless of license class. It may also be operated by a generally inactive licensee. It also allows non-licensed persons to operate the station under the direct supervision of an appropriate control operator.

So with 4 HF stations, a 2 meter and DStar stations available for use during Field Day there is ample opportunity for anyone who wishes to get on the air to do so. If your license class does not allow you to operate on the lower bands, this is your chance to get on those bands. So do not miss this opportunity!

If you want to; operate one of the HF stations; help an operator log contacts; help man the information booth or help with the setup, please contact Cameron. His email address is aj4tw@arrl.net.

In addition to providing you an opportunity to operate on the lower bands, the Field Day committee is planning to serve lunch and dinner to club members and their families. To ensure that there is a demand Cameron Conover, AJ4TW, is asking if you plan to dine with us during Field Day please contact him and let him know which day and meal (lunch, dinner or both) you plan to attend and how many in your party. Silent Key - Charles "Weldon" Fields, W4AJT

Weldon was the oldest known Ham in North Carolina and the longest licensed amateur radio operator in our State having received his license in 1930. Weldon made many contributions to our Country, our State, and to amateur radio during his lifetime. He was a founding father of the Tar Heel Emergency Net in 1947, which continues operations to this day. In September of 2011, the Order of the Long Leaf Pine was bestowed upon Weldon W4AJT (SK). The Order of the Long Leaf Pine is among the most

prestigious awards conferred by the Governor of North Carolina and it is presented to outstanding North Carolinians with a proven record of service to the State or other special achievement. In 2014, Weldon W4AJT was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal -- the highest civilian honor -for his service to the Civil Air Patrol during World War II. Since he was unable to attend the ceremony in Washington, DC, it was awarded to him in Greensboro last January.

Congratulations! You Passed!





May/June Engineering Update


Status of the VHF FM repeater is unchanged. Still working fine, but with what I think is homegrown static that is only there when the transmitter is keyed. Hoping I am wrong on that and that maybe something will change when the Yaesu System Fusion repeater is put inline, doubtful of this however, and we probably will need work done on the antenna system on the tower. In the next few weeks I'd like to test this out by putting another RX inline that we can listen to, whilst keying the repeater and see if the crackling noise is there only when we transmit or constantly in some form.

As for the status of the System Fusion repeater, the club is still awaiting its order to be filled. A lot of clubs across North America took advantage of the offer and they are still backlogged. The board placed a order this week for the Arcom repeater controller that will go inline with the new repeater. Arcom had a Dayton special this week so we were able to save some money. This controller will be a good asset for the club and will be able to easily be changed and programmed by future club engineering committees.

Locally there are two online in Rockingham County by the Rockingham County Amateur Radio Club, another one by the Forsyth Amateur Radio Club, another two planned by KF4OVA on the Piedmont Repeater

System in High Point and Kernersville on UHF, and lastly a second in High Point by NC4AR on VHF. A list of local repeaters planned can be seen here, by KF4OVA http://yaesusystemfusion.webs.com/repeater-list.

The UHF repeater has been doing ok recently. No changes made this month other than the drive output on the repeater being increased and the amplifier output being reduced. Back in February when we checked the Dstar repeater output we found it to be at 130 watts output. I didn't think much of it at the time, but I thought I remembered that when the repeater was first put online in 2008 that the output was around 80 watts. At some point we ended up dropping the input to reduce the drives output, however this caused the data channels on



the signal to drop and error out, especially to people at range from the repeater and not people like me that live down the street from it. We were advised that the input needed to be increased and the output set at 80 watts. Information found online set me on the right path on how to do that, and Cameron, AJ4TW, and I went out to the site to make the change. Looking at the repeaters signal on a spectrum display showed that the two data channels looked much better and defined after the change. Attached is a picture of the signal the main hump being the voice channel and the two data channels on each side.

I look forward seeing everyone at the GARA Field Day this year! This will be the first time we have put on Field Day as A.R.E.S. has been doing it in the past, though obviously most of the same people are involved. We will have dedicated CW, Voice, and Data stations online this year, as well as operating a mesh net, Sat station and G.O.T.A. station. Fun to be had by all! The next month the Field Day crew will be busy getting everything ready.
