
Jesse Lindley, K4AX, was unable to unable to attend the meeting so Cameron said he will put Jesse's engineering report on the website.

Cameron gave the presentation on HT emissions. Cameron had a spectrum analyzer and tested several of the low cost HTs as well as am Icom HT


David Bond, KK4VC,G made a motion to adjourn, Chris Thompson, K4HC, seconded and the motion passed. The meeting ended at 8:13pm.

January Engineering Update

I hope everyone has done well the past month, staying warm and safe during the winter weather events and have enjoyed the nice sunny and slightly warm days in between. Personally on the ham radio front I've been getting back on HF a bit more and try to make a few new contacts each day after work if I have time, mostly filling holes on needed DX or DX on a particular band. The last couple of years I have nailed down DXCC mixed, voice, CW and digital, and on the 20m band. Now I am trying to pull out DXCC on the rest of the bands, and I'm getting close on a couple, but there is a lot of work to be done. It's nice to have a long-




term goal (for me) and keeps me going sometimes when my interest is down.

Those that know me, know that I enjoy using SDR rigs, and my current rig is FlexRadio 5000A. At this point

it has become a bit dated, though for a rig that's been out for seven years the performance is pretty good. One thing that has been interesting to see is how the software has improved the performance of the radio over time, with added features and some bug fixes. FlexRadio moved on to direct sample SDR rigs and the 5000a was left behind in software, the last major release fixing most fixing bugs and it's pretty solid. The nice thing is the software is open source, and recently Darrin Kohn, KE9NS has been adding features and posting almost daily updates to PowerSDR for the FlexRadios of the last generation. I won't go over the changes here, but if anyone is interested check out http://www.ke9ns.com/flexpage.html for more information and a revision history. Every few days it's been fun to download the latest and see what new feature or improvement Darrin has made for my radio.



In the VHF department 145.150 has been seeing a lot of crackle recently. I've talked before one what I think is happening to this (duplex only crackle) however it's only a guess at best. I hope soon Cameron and I can go out and make sure the sensitivity on the machine is where it is supposed to be and adjust accordingly if needed. Last year around this time we found it to be 10db down, but all that was needed was a simple tweak on the preselector to get it back where it was it was supposed to be.

In the Yaesu Fusion repeater area of interest we are still in a holding pattern waiting for Yaesu to get the rig back to us. That should be any day and we can proceed with getting it installed when it shows up.

For UHF the D=Star repeater has been doing well the last month. The only issue we had being loosing the internet connection for a few days. Making the trip out there it was quickly discovered the issue was in the billing department and not the engineering department, due to the transition of board members. The account billing is now fixed and we are back online.

We still have plans to replace the router at the site, and a Scott Toth donated a Cisco switch so when we do replace the router we will have plenty of ports to plug things into. Last week Scott, Ed Miller and I went out to the site to set the switch up. Scott does a lot for the club, maintaining the website, and running the tech forum and his contributions are greatly appreciated!

That is about all I have for now, I look forward to seeing everyone at the club meeting this coming week, and hopefully at the N4G operating event in March. As usual David, AJ4TF, is on the ball getting it planned out and it should be a great time for all!
