The past month in the "engineering department" for GARA has kept a few of us busy chasing down issues at the related to internet issues mostly, and connectivity between the two computers currently at the repeater site for DSTAR control and linking. For several weeks the DSL router has had to be restarted sometime over the weekend to get the connection back, and we lost a USB Ethernet adapter to failure on the DSTAR gateway computer. Steve KB7SQI and I went out to the site to check out the Ethernet connectivity situation, and Steve solved a configuration problem with and donated a couple of his USB nics to get us going again.

I'd also like to thank Scott KV4UP, our club's vice president and the cool guy who

has set us up with some great presentations this year! Scott has donated some computer equipment to the club to be used

with the repeaters, including a Dell computer, Ethernet switch, and soon a router. All to be used for future expansion for things like repeater control, Playing Newsline and other

been performing well. Power and SWR output have unchanged since the last check and the machine seems to be performing well.

The VHF machine is still chugging along. No issues at all to report of as of late, other than the same static interference that we have had for over ten

years. We still have plans to recheck the machines sensitivity soon, in case the preselector values have shifted.

Everyone that has visited the site with me the last few weeks has commented that our antenna's don't look straight on the tower. I tend to agree and I think our VHF antenna that in the past appeared straight, seems to be at a angle leaning to the southwest, it's noticeable mostly when standing underneath it. In the past it and the N4DUB repeaters antenna seemed to be straight and the DSTAR antenna was out of whack.

I'm still working on the Fusion repeater controller, I had some scheduler issues that put the machine in net mode when I didn't want it to, I want to see that it's working before I install it. I'm about finished with the Fusion machine and I look forward to gaining some desk space when it's away. There maybe some on the air testing with limited functions at first when it's installed, but it won't affect normal day to day operations at all.

### **Congratulations! You Passed!**

Every month on the second Saturday, except in March when it is the third Saturday, W4VEC holds a testing session for those who live in the area. This provides an opportunity for individuals to be able to test for their amateur radio license or upgrade.
