NEXT MEETING April 23, 2018

The next meeting of the Greensboro Amateur Radio Association will be held at the Cooper's Ale House on Swing Road in Greensboro on April 23, 2018. The program will be presented by Matt Trull, KX4GG, who will be discussing FT-8 digital mode.



Two radio amateurs are now on the International Space Station. With the addition of three new crew members, the International Space Station now has a full complement of six. Astronauts Ricky Arnold, KE5DAU, and Drew Feustel, and cosmonaut Oleg Artemyev headed into space on March 21 aboard a *Soyuz* MS-08 vehicle, launched from Kazakhstan. The new ISS

residents were welcomed as part of the Expedition 55 crew by station commander Anton Shkaplerov and crew -- Scott Tingle, KG5NZA, and Norishige Kanai. During his time in space, Arnold, a former educator, will wrap up NASA's Year of Education on Station, an initiative to engage students and educators in human spaceflight and science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) careers. Arnold and Tingle will share Amateur Radio on the International Space Station (ARISS) contacts with schools during April.

The Amateur Radio population has grown steadily over the past decade.

At nearly 378,000, Technician licensees represented the largest segment, with General (174,206), Amateur Extra (145,034), Advanced (41,938), and Novice (9,056) trailing. Licensee numbers showed continued growth across all classes except Advanced and Novice, which the FCC no longer issues; those numbers continue to drop.

"I'm hopeful that the number of new licensees will be more than 30,000 at the end of this year," ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, said. "I would love to see this trend continue!"

Also on order is a new Henry UHF 100 W amplifier. With an additional Raspberry controller and other cables, etc. this new repeater will be able to do D-Star, Fusion digital as well as possibly DMR in the future.

Chandlee White – Finance Chair expressed appreciation for the contributions that will make the replacement of the D-Star repeater possible without affecting the regular budget.

Program: David McLin – AC4A GARA Vice President presented the program about "Grounding and Bonding for the Radio Amateur" based on the recent ARRL book of the same name.

There are a few things to mention, but this month I'm going to try to keep it brief (surprise!). First of all, most of you are aware of the board's efforts to replace our aging D-star repeater and gateway setup. I'm happy to report that all of the necessary funds have been raised (this project is not using any general account funds at all) and all of the new equipment has been ordered and received. We're making fast progress and our engineering team will begin to get things configured and tested soon. We also have ambition to have our repeater duplexers retuned once the new repeater is installed so that both our VHF and UHF machines are working at peak ability.

On a different note, Field Day is approaching quickly. We plan on setting up at Hagan Stone Park like we did last year, but as always, we're looking for volunteers to help organize equipment, logistics, etc. Please consider helping with this and let me or any of the other board members know if we can count on your assistance.

I'm really looking forward to hearing from Matt Trull, KX4GG about FT8 at our meeting this Monday. FT8 is an enticing mode that gives quick results. If you haven't used it yet but want to learn how, this will be an excellent opportunity to hear how to setup your gear and the software for best results Be prepared to get hooked!

April Engineering Report

Work continues at the repeater site to upgrade our systems and improve both functionality and reliability. In the near future we will be installing a larger battery back up to replace the small APC unit. I am donating the APC Back-UPS Pro 1500 unit, and John W4DX has graciously donated the funds to purchase the needed batteries for this unit. Previously we were using two smaller units, one of which the battery failed a few months ago, and the other has failed within the last week. Rather than replace the batteries in those units we will put in place a larger single unit that has more capacity than both of those combined.

Coming up we will also be able to finish reworking the DC power cables and distribution in the rack. All the necessary supplies have been ordered so that this work can be completed in conjunction with the D-Star system upgrade.

I would like to extend a big Thank You to all of the club members who have donated time, work, and money to make all of these things possible. It's great that we are able to accomplish these things without impacting our normal operating budget.

Field Day is on the horizon. Hagan Stone Park is a great venue and I hope that you will join us this year. If you like to camp, there is plenty of area to set up your tent and you can join us around the fire ring. We could certainly use some more operators this year. This is a great opportunity to operate under full HF privileges and there will be some very knowledgeable operators there for you to engage with. Other club members are a wealth of knowledge and having the chance to talk with them and ask questions is one of my favorite parts of participating. Maybe you are newly licensed and want to get a better understanding of basic wire antennas and operating under contest conditions, maybe you like to check out other station setups and field ops, or maybe you are a seasoned veteran and just enjoy the camaraderie. Wherever your interests lie, I encourage you to join us and I look forward to seeing you there!
