Regular Meeting Minutes February 25, 2012

The Greensboro Amateur Radio Association held its monthly meeting on February 25th, 2012, at Captain Bill's Seafood & Steakhouse located at 6108 West Market Street in Greensboro. GARA president, Donna Ferguson, KD4WIK, called the meeting to order at 19:20.

Donna reminded everyone to respect others and keep things family rated.

Officer reports

David Macchiarolo, AJ4TF, said that he is suspicious of the receiver on the VHF repeater after the lightning strike that we had at the tower site recently. David said the repeater seems to have lost some of its sensitivity so he will swap to the backup repeater as soon as he can get over to the site.

David said that he now has an engineering committee with Craig Bondy, N8STA; Layman Idol, KK4LLY; and Ken Worland, KK4GSM, volunteering to assist him.

David also spoke about the N4G special event station coming up on March 16 & 17. Setup will be on March 15th at 1300. David said that he has all equipment lined up and just needs people to work. David spoke about last year's event.

Donna asked everyone to identify themselves.

Donna spoke about the ARISS contact coming up in April. RF micro devices will donate a ham station to McNair Elementary School where the ARISS contact will be made.

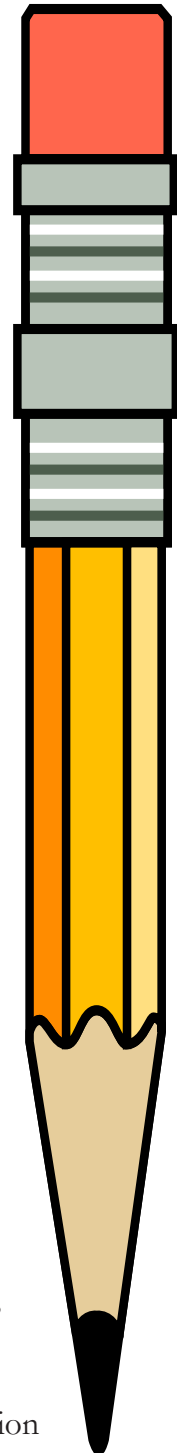
David Macchiarolo, AJ4TF, gave the presentation on coaxial cable.

COMMENTS WELCOMED – One of the things ARRL does on behalf of Amateur Radio is to advocate with federal and international regulators. The Western Hemisphere falls under Region 2 of the IARU (International Amateur Radio Union), the international body which coordinates Amateur Radio frequencies and use. ARRL is seeking comments on proposed IARU revisions which would bring 40 meter CW and digital modes in Region 2 into alignment with Region 1 (Europe, Africa, Middle East and Northern Asia) and Region 3 (China, SE Asia and Australia/New Zealand). IARU bandplan recommendations are just that – recommendations – and are not codified by the FCC, however once adopted are generally observed. In IARU Region 2, narrow band modes are permitted 7.0-7.125 MHz. The IARU proposal would be to cut narrow mode use from 7.0 to 7.04 MHz in Region 2. 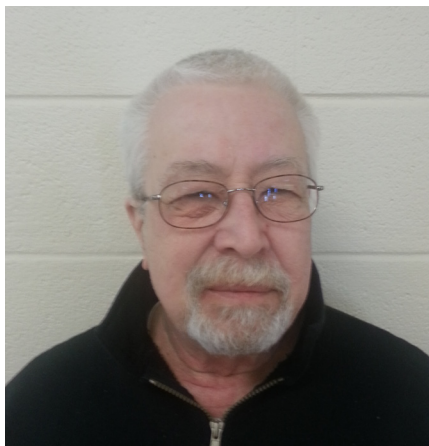

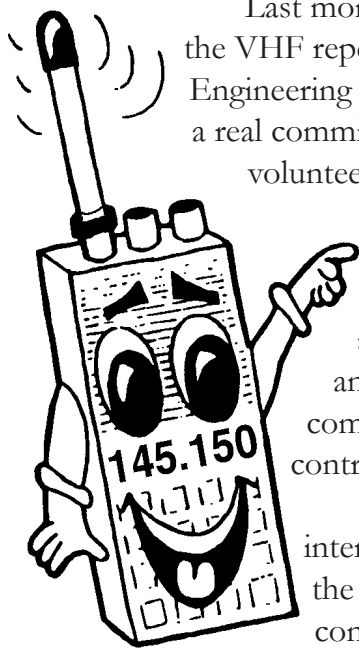

Engineering Update for March, 2013

Last month, we talked about the repeater site being hit by lightning on Thursday, January 17th. Recently we have noticed that the RX sensitivity of the VHF repeater seems to be lower than normal. This could be a result of latent damage to the repeater from the lightning strike, or it could also be due to the periodic interference issue that we see about once a year or so. After we get done with the N4G station, we'll try to investigate it a little more.



Last month I told you about a couple of projects that I am considering for the VHF repeater, and that I was looking for some volunteers to be a part of the Engineering Committee. I am happy to report that the engineering Committee is now a real committee! Ken (KK4GSM), Layman (KK4LLY), and Craig (N8STA), have all volunteered to be a part of the action.

Here is the status of the projects I told you about last month:

1) Investigate replacement controller: As you know the existing repeater controller, while it works well, is obsolete, and in the case of a hardware failure, we do not have a backup controller on hand. Ken and Layman are still looking at the differences between the controller commands for the existing controller, and a proposed replacement controller.

2) Replacement for AR NewsLine Phone Patch: An audio playing interface connection to the VHF repeater controller. Craig has built up the circuit that could connect into an unused port on the VHF repeater controller to perform this, and I have done enough work on a Raspberry Pi computer that has convinced me that this could be the right interface platform to actually access and play the audio. Look for a club meeting presentation on the Raspberry Pi in the next few months.

UHF D-Star Repeater:

There are some clean up activities that I need to do on the gateway computer, which I will work on during the next couple of months. During the last backup attempt, I noticed that the D-Star software and database synchronization scripts were restarting on their own after I had killed them prior to the backup. On further examination, I saw that there is indeed an automatic restart function running in the operating system for those tasks. The problem with this, of course, is if the database happens to change in the middle of the backup, it could corrupt the backup! I have a method to prevent this from occurring in the future. This will take a little bit of programming, and I will work on this project after the N4G event.

ARRL Membership Through Affiliated Clubs Drive

GARA is looking at ways to cut the Club's expenses and increase the Club's revenue. One way to increase the Club's revenue is to take advantage of ARRL's Membership Through Affiliated Clubs program. This program allows an affiliated club to retain a proportion of ARRL's membership dues when a club member renews his ARRL membership or joins ARRL for the first time through his Club. The affiliated club receives \$2.00 for every ARRL membership renewal and \$15.00 for every new member. A new member is defined as anyone who has never joined ARRL or someone who has let his membership lapse for more than two years.

If you are a member of ARRL you can help the GARA by renewing your membership through the Club. If you are not a member of ARRL, and plan to join ARRL in the future please consider joining through GARA.

Since a renewing ARRL member can renew at any time, before their current membership expires, GARA will conduct an ARRL Membership Through Affiliated Clubs drive every 3 or 4 months. This allows the Club to cut the monthly expense of processing renewals/new memberships and insures your renewals/applications arrive in a timely manner to ARRL. We will start our first drive in February. So if your membership expires between April and the end of June or if you want to join ARRL please consider renewing/joining through GARA during our drive in February.

How do you renew/join through GARA? You fill out an ARRL Membership Application form (attached at the end of newsletter). Then you give/mail the application along with your ARRL dues to the Club's Treasurer. (The Club's address is: Greensboro Amateur Radio Association, P.O. Box 7054, Greensboro, NC 27417.) The Club then submits all application forms to ARRL less the Club's commission.

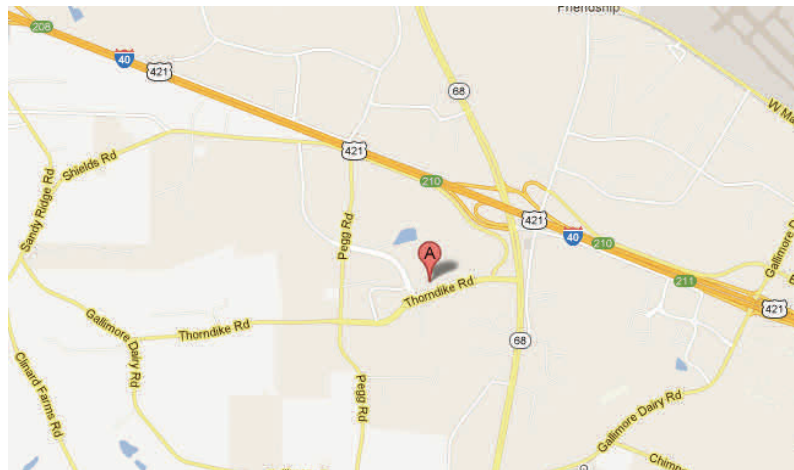
