Engineering Update for October, 2014


I hope everyone is doing well, and catching those W1AW/X stations. Unfortunately I missed a couple of states, so it will be impossible for me to obtain the certificate. However, I still catch them when I can. I did happen to pick up Montana and Oregon, two states that had eluded me to date.

Last month, I wrote to you about inexpensive (<\$30) GPS receivers that can be used as frequency references. These modules were designed for radio-controlled quadcopter drones, so they are relatively small. Well, I bought one. I haven't had time to do anything with it yet, but look for an article in the future regarding this device.

UHF (D-STAR) REPEATER

We are still operating on the borrowed power amplifier, and it is still working well. I'll let you know when I get the original amp back and get it installed.

I told you last month about a plan I concocted to use my IC-92 D-Star HT set on its lowest power setting (100mW = 20 dBM) connected to a 100 dB attenuator string, through the HT antenna, to generate a very low level signal into the repeater's antenna system, while monitoring it at the site. After thinking about this some



By monitoring what the repeater's receiver is seeing, we should be able to determine if the receiver is working as expected. I'll report when I am able to accomplish this.

VHF REPEATER

Although I don't listen to it during the whole day, my impression is that the interference on the VHF repeater has diminished. If someone has a different view, we would appreciate specifics (where were you, time of day, your operating conditions, etc.)

The club has an on-line problem reporting system that is available to members to submit reports of repeater operation or any other concerns. You can find this on the club web site.

Finally this month, it was reported at the last club meeting that I will relinquish the assignment of GARA Engineering Committee Chair in 2015 and let someone else have a go at it. It has been an interesting assignment, there is always something to think about and do. The demands upon my time

outside of GARA have given me less ability to put the time into this assignment, and, after almost 4 years, it's time to 'spread the wealth', so to speak. 
