Tom said the board will start working on Field Day plans soon, and the N4G Special Event Station is on track.


New business

FCC "Paperless" Amateur Radio License

Starting February 17, the FCC no longer will routinely issue paper license documents to Amateur Radio applicants and licensees. The Commission has maintained for some time now that the official Amateur Radio license authorization is the electronic record that exists in its Universal Licensing System (ULS), although the FCC has continued to print and mail hard copy licenses. In mid-December the FCC adopted final procedures to provide access to official electronic authorizations, as it had proposed in WT Docket 14-161 as part of its "process reform" initiatives.

Under the new procedures, licensees will access their current official authorization ("Active" status only) via the ULS License Manager. The FCC will continue to provide paper license documents to all licensees who notify the Commission that they prefer to receive one. Licensees also will be able to print out an official authorization - as well as an unofficial "reference copy" - from the ULS License Manager.

"We find this electronic process will improve efficiency by simplifying access to official authorizations in ULS, shortening the time period between grant of an application and access to the official authorization, and reducing regulatory costs," the FCC Wireless Telecommunications Bureau (WTB) said. According to the WTB, the new procedures will save at least \$304,000 a year, including the cost of staff resources.

In comments filed November 5, the ARRL had strongly recommended that the FCC "give serious consideration to continuing a default provision for sending an initial paper license document to new licensees in the Amateur Radio Service, along with detailed, simple instructions for how to make the elections set forth in the notice relative to future modified or renewed licenses."

The ARRL and other Amateur Radio commenters also worried that unless a license document is printed on distinctive paper stock, its authenticity could be questioned in such situations as obtaining vanity call sign license plates. To address this, the FCC said the watermark "Official Copy" will be printed on each page of an official authorization that a licensee prints out from the ULS.



February Engineering Update

From Jesse Lindley, K4AX

I am once again happy to be serving on the GARA. board again this year, but in a new position as Engineering Chairman. I'd also like to thank David Macchiarolo for serving the last four years; he did a great job and spent a lot of time and effort behind the scenes keeping things running smoothly with both repeater systems and documenting changes and procedures that will really help my job of doing the same in the future. David has offered to help if I need it, and I know I'll be calling on him in the future.

In December, the feed line and antennas were inspected and some issues were found. Both antennas are Decibel Products, folded dipole arrays. The dipoles are phased to attain gain that is mostly focused right on the horizon. The individual elements are connected via a phasing harness, and there is a possibility that due to age and weather, these need to be replaced. The inspection revealed a taped connection that has failed, the straps that holding the harness to the UHF antenna are breaking off, the mounting hardware that is used to secure the antennas to tower is corroded, and the UHF antenna appears to not be straight. The engineering committee will be looking at these issues and coming up with a plan to get them serviced soon.



Also on February 12th, when the power was off during a test of the backup generator, one of our UPS units failed to restore power back when the main power was back online. The backup batteries to the repeater controller drained, and it appears the voice playback files, that are stored in volatile memory on our twenty-year old controller, were lost. I'll flash the files back when the UPS batteries are replaced, so our repeater will have its voice back.

Fundraiser Dinner for Greg Spencer, March 7th



The planning for the 2015 edition of the N4G Special Event Station, commemorating the 234th anniversary of the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, is well under way. We'll be in the same place as the last three years, behind the Colonial Heritage Center in Tannenbaum Park, at the southeast corner of Battleground Ave and New Garden Road in Greensboro. We will set up on Friday March 13th 2015, and operate Saturday and Sunday, March 14th and 15th. Of course this is the same weekend as the annual reenactment of the Battle of Guilford Courthouse, which is the historical event that our special event station is celebrating.



We're planning on having our typical two HF positions and a VHF/UHF/D-Star position as usual, but we might try some CW and digital modes this year in addition to the regular phone contacts.

What we need most right now are OPERATORS. If you've never worked the HF bands, even if you don't currently have HF privileges, you can come out and try it out... we'll have control operators available so EVERYONE will be able to make some DX contacts, be involved in a historical event, and have some fun! Don't be shy... we make it easy, with a written script; even a beginner can make some good contacts.

Last year, Ken KK4GSM and Linda KK4LHH warmed up the airwaves, along with their granddaughter Katrina, and made dozens of contacts! I sat Katrina down in front of a radio, and gave her a few minutes of coaching. Within a short time, she had made 20 contacts by herself.
